Wed 18 Sep



We're at HMP Bronzefield. They do this. Stop the van outside the gates then leave you sat there like battery hens.

Chloë Moss' Sweatbox invites you to enter the back of a prison van, in which three women share their stories of arrival and anticipation as they are transported from court to prison, from prison to prison, from prison to court.

Clean Break was set up in 1979 by two women prisoners who believed that theatre could bring the hidden stories of imprisoned women to a wider audience. Still the only women's theatre company of its kind, Clean Break has remained true to these roots, and we continue to inspire playwrights and captivate audiences with our ground-breaking plays on the complex theme of women and crime.

How is care given in one of our most precious national services? We are the most in debt, obese, addicted and medicated people in history. We ask on a dwindling, fractured and skeletal NHS infrastructure - what is care? How do we continue to care for everyone?

From birth to death, joy and heartbreak in a single breath, *Care* celebrates 70 years of the NHS.

A joyful, fascinating and socially revelatory look at what it means to care in 2019 with a combination of beautiful, playful movement-driven visual theatre, powerful and humorous storytelling.

Following BOYS, The Pappy Show return to HOME with their brand-new show.

The Pappy Show are a playful physical and visual ensemble theatre company. Formed in January 2013 by Kane Husbands in order to provide a much-needed space for actors to train in physical theatre, they use exercises and training to devise and create work.

A GENEROUS LOVER

This is the true and very queer tale, of one soul's journey through the wasteland of mental illness, to deliver their lost love.

Brimming with psychedelic proletarian prose, and trenchant wit, it recounts the pandemonium of navigating mental health services on behalf of a loved one, whilst being gender gueer, and occasionally being mistaken for a patient.

Drawing on epic poetry, classical mythology, and queer modernist literature, A Generous Lover fuses psychology, euphonic prose, and song, to create an intimate and beguiling world. Somewhere between a seance and a recital, it delves into psychosis with compassion, hoping to find catharsis.

La JohnJoseph is an associate artist at HOME and works at the intersection of artist film and live performance, investigating the convergence of social class, gender identity, and religious faith in the matrices of social power.



They're pretty special. They give a person the opportunity to express themselves. They can be read. They can be heard. They can be spoken. They allow us to communicate. I was always told that it's not what you say, but how you say it - is this true?

Become the contestant or host in an audience-led gameshow that puts the words we use under a magnifying glass.

Following *The Privileged* (Orbit Festival 2016), Jamal Harewood returns to HOME with *Word*. He is a live artist who creates temporary communities through participatory events and believes that these events should be playful experiences that allow everyone to get involved. The performances create a focus on themes of identity and race within the community.

QUEENS OF SHEBA

After being turned away from a nightclub for being "too black", a group of friends' lives are changed forever when confronted with misogynoir in its most vicious form. Jessica L Hagan's debut play Queens of Sheba sheds a light on the lives of everyday women battling what shouldn't be an everyday problem: the collision of racism and misogyny.

Through poetry, movement and gripping storytelling, the award-winning piece delicately retells the stories of a real-life incident that occurred at a London nightclub in 2015, retold by four women who reaffirm the joys of sisterhood – implicating us in an hour-long journey of laughter and reflection.

Nouveau Riché is a multi award-winning arts production company and an ever-expanding creative movement. In under two years, this dedicated team of passionate artists have sold out the Edinburgh Fringe and won the 2018 Edinburgh Stage and Untapped Awards, this company is one to watch not just in 2019 but for years to come.

This dynamic emerging company stars four refugees who made the arduous journey to the UK on their own as children from Afghanistan, Eritrea and Albania.

They have told their 'stories' repeatedly to the Home Office as part of seeking asylum and it is the desire to reclaim these stories that grounds Phosphoros Theatre's innovative work. From the precinct of a pizza shop we embark on a journey across time and continents to explore how they got here, where they're going and what they've learnt along the way. It's a story of male and cultural identity, of family and fatherhood, a lyrical collage of memories, hopes, dreams and imagined realities. From prisons in Libya and Greece to conversations with absent mothers to raising the next generation of sons.

Powerful, celebratory, affirming, authentic; this is theatre that puts refugees centre stage.
