FINDING HOME

The easiest way to reach us is via public transport

BY BUS HOME is close to several bus routes into Manchester city centre, including the free Metroshuttle bus, route 2. You can also plan your journey using the Transport for Greater Manchester route explorer (tfgm.com/route-explorer)

BY BIKE Bike parking is available next door to HOME

BY TRAM Deansgate-Castlefield is the nearest Metrolink stop, less than five minutes walk away from HOME. We're also just a short hop from St Peter's Square Metrolink station.

Check the Metrolink website for times and updates.

BY RAIL The nearest rail stations are Deansgate and Oxford Road, which are both a five-minute walk away from HOME. If you arrive at Piccadilly or Victoria, we are a 20-minute walk away (or jump on a Metroshuttle free bus service at the station for connecting routes covering the main areas in the city centre).

BY CAR Manchester is easily accessible from motorway networks, including the M60 ring road. HOME is located in the city centre. The nearest car park is Q-Park at First Street (next door to HOME). Visitors to HOME get a 20% discount on parking (validate your ticket in the venue). HOME Friends and Members get their first hour's parking free.

On the Manchester Music Tour the New Manchester Walks team take you to the places where Manchester music history was made: from Piccadilly Gardens where Buzzcocks had their photo taken for the cover of the first do-it-yourself punk record, 'Spiral Scratch', and where in the film 24 Hour Party People the young Happy Mondays try to feed the pigeons crack cocaine; to Dry Bar; the Hacienda; the Free Trade Hall; the Ritz; the Boardwalk; and the basement record shop where Morrissey once worked – yes! – for five minutes, resulting in a depression that inspired those great opening lines from 'Heaven Knows I'm Miserable Now'.

MAKE AN AFTERNOON OF IT

If you fancy spending a cultural couple of hours, here's our recommendation for a great art walk taking in a handful of Manchester's many great galleries.

Take the Metrolink to St Peter's Square, and make your first stop Manchester Art Gallery, with its great collection of over 25,000 objects of fine art, decorative art and costume. Film fans could also make a quick stop at the wonderful refurbished Central Library, to soak up highlights from the world's greatest and most diverse collection of British film and television in the British Film Institute Mediatheque. Head down Lower Mosely Street, taking a slight detour up Hewitt Street to Castlefield Gallery, where you can see new work from the North West's emerging artistic talent. From here you're just five minutes away from First Street and HOME, where you can stop for a well-earned coffee and a viewing of our first exhibition, featuring work from eleven artists, including Manchester's own Gemma Parker.

If you're in the mood for a longer walk, why not add The Whitworth (located in Whitworth Park, Oxford Road) or the Centre For Chinese Contemporary Art (Thomas Street in the Northern Quarter) to your itinerary?

CLOUDS OF SILS MARIA (15)

At the peak of her international career, veteran stage actress Maria Enders, played by the luminous Binoche, is asked to perform in a revival of the play that made her famous twenty years ago. The latest work from French auteur Olivier Assayas (Summer Hours, Something in the Air) is among his finest and cofirms his talent for fashioning complex tales about women. Written at the behest of Binoche, this is an urgent and magisterial film that delves into the female psyche.

The Tribe is a bold feature which confidently uses Ukrainian sign language to convey its story of extreme teenage behaviour in a specialised boarding school for deaf students.

Deaf mute Sergey is the new kid in class, and in this daunting new environment, he discovers the brutal hierarchy of 'the Tribe': the school's shadowy criminal network.

A GIRL WALKS HOME ALONE AT NIGHT (15)

Dir. Ana Lily Amirpour/US 2014/ 99 mins/Persian wEng ST Sheila Vand, Arash Marandi, Marshall Manesh

Billed as the first Iranian vampire Western, A Girl Walks Home Alone at Night is a stylish and inventive take on the vampire genre that also takes in pulp novels,

film noir and the Iranian new wave. In short it's an incredible genre mash up that's far more than the sum of its parts.

ONLY ANGELS HAVE WINGS (U)

Dir. Howard Hawks/US 1939/ 121 mins Cary Grant, Jean Arthur, Rita Hayworth

Somewhere in the claustrophobic and geographically challenging landscape of a remote part of South America there's a ramshackle, fog-bound port and a landing strip from where postal pilots risk their lives over mountain passes to win a lucrative delivery contract. Into the life of an ace pilot and despatcher arrive two women: one a sassy nightclub pianist, the other his ex-lover. Treat yourself to one of Hawks's most enjoyable explorations of his favourite themes: love, loyalty and the connections between strong-willed women and stoical men.

Intertwining themes of lust, longing and taboo with insight and humour, Ozon crafts a tale attuned to the nuances of LGBTQ identities that radiates empathy and understanding.
