BE PART OF A GROUNDBREAKING INITIATIVE: THE RIPPLES OF HOPE FESTIVAL

The Ripples of Hope Business & Investment Summit is a part of and supports the creation of the first-ever [Ripples of Hope Festival](#), developed by Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights UK.

To be publicly announced at the evening event on 30th January 2020, [The Ripples of Hope Festival](#) will take place across Greater Manchester on 11th-14th February 2021.

Supported by Manchester City Council and the Greater Manchester Combined Authority, we are bringing together the arts, business, communities, activists, NGOs and the public to tell a new local and actionable story about human rights - one that is rooted in communities and the everyday.

The Festival will

- build public understanding of and support for human rights;
- create artistic and cultural engagement with the cause of furthering human rights;
- promote human rights education for young people;
- strengthen the community activism & human rights ecosystem; and
- promote human rights as a vital strategic imperative in the business and investment community.

Curated by Jude Kelly CBE, the Festival will consist of a range of cultural, artistic and human rights related formats and content, from workshops and creative collaborations to debates, awards and concerts. These activities – alongside the Business & Investment Summit - may include:

- [A Young People's Day](#) that builds on our education programme to demonstrate the power of young people to demand and create change;
- '[In Conversation With...](#)' events that brings together human rights activists and artists, including globally-known figures, to explore how we can make human rights reality;
- [Ripples of Hope Film Festival](#) that shares films that bring the ideals of Ripples of Hope to life;
- [Artistic Commissions](#) that convene national and international artists, writers and musicians to re-tell the story of human rights and our power to create change for the 21st Century;
- [Human Rights Trailblazers](#), which is a history exhibit that shares the many different stories of people who have made change possible; and
- [The Ripples of Hope Awards](#) that recognise community organisations that are doing the work of making human rights reality.

The Festival will be a space for collaboration and learning as well as a platform for celebration and commitment to the cause of making human rights reality. Our vision is to build the Festival to be an international events platform by 2025.

WHY GREATER MANCHESTER THIS IS THE PLACE

Greater Manchester is the ideal home of The Ripples of Hope, as it presents a powerful combination of heritage, culture, community and possibility:

Historic Significance: Greater Manchester has a proud history of social and economic progress. As the home of the Industrial Revolution, it inspired global worker rights movements. The people of Manchester campaigned for universal suffrage at Peterloo and women's suffrage through Emmeline Pankhurst and the WSPU. The Lancashire mill workers sided with Abraham Lincoln and the Union, suffering a famine because they did so, as they refused to touch raw cotton picked by slaves under the Confederacy.

Cultural Significance: Greater Manchester is renowned for its artistic and cultural influence, having produced some of the UK's most significant and influential artists of every type, underpinned by the belief that arts and culture have the power to change lives.

Community: As it demonstrated once more so powerfully in 2017, Greater Manchester has a strong sense of community and passion that chimes strongly with a human rights, people-focused agenda. Its diverse community, facing complex

challenges, is home to a thriving and innovative social impact sector, which we hope to help showcase to the world.

A dynamic city built on a thriving and forward-looking economy: With distinctive strengths in science, advanced manufacturing, culture and creative and digital business sectors, Greater Manchester is well placed to continue and accelerate the transformation of the past two decades. As such, it will be a place that finds the answers to the world's future challenges, as it has done so often before.

Greater Manchester is a place that has helped shape the world. Whether it is in industry, science or culture Manchester has always pioneered new ways of working and thinking and has, in doing so, transformed itself into a modern cosmopolitan powerhouse.

That's why the first-ever Ripples of Hope Festival will not only take place in Greater Manchester – it will also be created, designed and developed in partnership with its people. Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights UK is also investing in the region by launching our human rights education programme in schools across Greater Manchester.
