### BEHIND THE SUN: PRÊMIO MARCANTÔNIO VILAÇA CNI SESI SENAI

Until Sun 25 Sep

Marcantonio Vilaça CNI Sesi Senai is the largest contemporary art prize in Brazil and this exhibition is a snapshot of new work from across the country. With original performance, sculpture and photography, *Behind the Sun* challenges our preconceptions of a country that's often reduced to frivolous, carnival-esque stereotypes.

## RACHEL MACLEAN: WOT U :- ) ABOUT?

Sat 29 Oct 2016 – Sun 8 Jan 2017

This major solo exhibition is by acclaimed artist Rachel Maclean, who will represent Scotland at the 2017 Venice Biennale. Maclean uses the humble fairytale to examine the murky boundary between childhood and adulthood. She explores ideas of happiness and childhood as qualities that can be packaged and sold – resulting in unsettling adventures located in a wonderland reminiscent of the supersaturated, candy-coloured palette of children's television.



Centered on a linked series of three new video works, *Wot u :- ) about?* also features large-format prints and larger-than-life figurative sculptures that directly relate to and overlap with the props, costumes and aesthetic found within her films.

Rachel's sculptures play on ideas around the cult of youth and the exaggerated enthusiasm of 'happiness marketing'. They take the form of part playground-equipment, part grotesque, bloated mannequins, which on closer inspection are being eaten alive by swarms of razor-toothed dolls.

## JOHN HYATT: ROCK ART

John Hyatt is an artist, musician, scientist and irrepressible explorer. His latest exhibition brings the findings, objects and narratives of his restless inquiry together for a celebration of creative adventure, the results of years of solo and collaborative work that blend music, magic and mathematics. Each week a new exhibition appears, each curated by John Hyatt's alternate personas, including the likes of Sir Stuart Farquar; The Pilot of Bee Patrol; Gerry Windrim and others.
